The Item, appraisal report

One all white metal ring that has not been stamped .Readily apparent identification indicates the metal to be platinum.

This ring features a row of rubies which are end channel set surrounded by baguette and brilliant cut diamonds all arranged as a stylised buckle and open fret work on the sides.

The overall height is 4.70 mm and the width is 12.10 mm. The band has a flat profile which tapers to 6.25 mm wide x 1.17 mm thick at

This ring has been handcrafted using a variety of techniques, which include hand assembly, using hand fabricated components with traditional hand forming, setting and finishing,

Condition, appraisal report Claws show up to 70 % wear (rubies), Sides show up to 30 % wear, Band shows up to 5 % wear. This item was most likely made circa 1970. It has been well cared for and is in good condition. All stones have been checked and found to be tight and secure in the settings at the time of inspection.

Gemmological appraisal report (with estimated characteristics) **Baquette diamonds**

There are 4 diamonds each is baguette cut. Each measures 3.00 mm x 2, 400 mm in width, the colour and clarity grades are EFG/VsI and the total weight is estimated at 0.40 cts.

Round diamonds

There are 4 small diamonds each is early single cut. Each measures 1,40 mm in width, the colour and clarity grades are H/SI and the total weight is estimated at 0.04 cts.

Round diamonds

There are 16 small diamonds each is modern brilliant cut. Each measures 2.40 mm in width, the colour and clarity grades are H/SI and the total weight is estimated at 0.80 cts.

Estimated Coloured Stone Characteristics

Type = corundum /combination of natural and synthetic.

Variety = ruby.

Shape and size $= 4.00 \text{ mm} \times 2.50 \text{ mm}.$

Clarity = moderate

The stones shows moderate to severe surface wear and abrasions .

The hue, (or colour) is described as violet red.

The tone, (or darkness) is described as (8) On a Scale 1 to 9 where 9 is black and 1 is nil

The saturation, (or intensity) of colour is described (8) on a scale of 1 to 10, where 0 is low and 10 is vivid.

This item has been most likely privately imported into New Zealand circa 1970 the exact item is not available ,however comparable items are available from those retail jewellers who specialize in used sales of this type and age of items .It has been valued in this market for market value new .

In this case there is some wear to the settings and the rubies and therefore an adjustment has been made to allow for this and to represent the market value of the item, in its current condition.
