The Item, appraisal report

One yellow and white gold ring that has been stamped 18 ct. This ring features a row of three sapphires separated by two diamonds which have all been claws set into "Rex" style coronets each sits onto a small yellow collet. These are all mounted directly onto a flat tapered band with pressed leaf shoulders.

The overall height is 5.51 mm and the width is 4.75 mm. The band has a flat profile tapers to 2.84 mm wide x 0.88 mm thick at the base.

This ring has been handcrafted using a variety of techniques, which include hand assembly, using machine fabricated components with traditional hand forming, setting and finishing.

Condition, appraisal report Claws show up to 10 % wear, Sides show up to 2 % wear, Band shows up to 5 % wear.

Gemmological appraisal report (with estimated characteristics)

Main diamonds are both modern brilliant cut.

Colour = HJ
Dimensions = both = 3.64 mm x 2.20 mm deep
Weight = 0.36 cts, total
Clarity = VS
Crown angle = 32 degrees
Table = 60 % of the width of the diamond.
Girdle = ground

Estimated Coloured Stone Characteristics

Type = corundum
Variety = sapphire
Shape and size = all round/faceted/4.80mm and 2 x 3.00 mm.
Treatment = heat
Clarity = moderate

The stones shows moderate surface wear and abrasions.

The hue, (or colour) is described as slightly violet blue.

The tone, (or darkness) is described as (8) On a Scale 1 to 9 where 9 is black and 1 is nil

The saturation, (or intensity) of colour is described (3) on a scale of 1 to 10, where 0 is low and 10 is vivid.

Note. It is normal practice for all coloured stones to be treated in various ways to enhance the colour and appearance. If there is evidence of treatment it is noted, if not, some may be assumed. Advanced gemmological procedures may be required to prove



VALUATION REPORT (market explanation) with additional comments on page four.

This item has been most likely manufactured in New Zealand the exact item is not available, however comparable items are available through retail manufacturing jewellers often on a "make on request" basis. It has been valued in this market for market value new.

Market value (new) sometimes called "**replacement value**" for a comparable item = \$6,100.00

In this case there is some very slight wear and therefore an adjustment has been made to allow for this and to represent the market value of the item, in its current condition.

Market value (in its current condition) sometimes called "indemnity value", present day value or fair value = \$6,000.00

Should you require a new and single item to be made as close as possible to the original using modern day techniques then please use the cost estimate value. As this represents the most likely cost to buy from a retail manufacturing jeweller as a single bespoke piece. Note this value has been arrived at using the cost approach.
