The Item, appraisal report

One all yellow gold ring that has been stamped 15 ct . This is a classic "London bridge" style ring with the rubies all claw set around the finger over a square pierced gallery. The overall height is 3.75 mm and the width is 5.51 mm. The band has a slightly rounded profile which tapers to 1.76 mm wide x 1.02 mm thick at the base.

This ring has been handcrafted using a variety of techniques, which include hand fabricated components with traditional hand forming, setting and finishing.

Condition, appraisal report Claws show up to 5 % wear, Sides show up to 20 % wear, Band shows up to 20 % wear. This item has been well cared for (with claws, and sides having been rebuilt. )and is in good condition, there are some minor microscopic. The stones have been checked for tightness, several are loose.

The stones show moderate surface wear and abrasions.

The saturation, (or intensity) of colour is described (5) on a scale of 1 to 10, where 0 is low and 10 is vivid.

Note. It is normal practice for all coloured stones to be treated in various ways to enhance the colour and appearance. If there is evidence of treatment it is noted, if not, some may be assumed. Advanced gemmological procedures may be required
