Marama had arrived just after the evacuation began on December 19, 1915, and embarked her first wounded troops from Gallipoli and Salonika. Ultimately Marama carried many thousands of wounded to England, of all nationalities in the British Commonwealth and also made voyages back to New Zealand to bring home wounded kiwi soldiers. In later life Frank went on to become the Chief Commissioner for St John in New Zealand and was awarded the OBE and presented the Order of the Knight of St John by the Queen in 1954.
